# To support and promote the Lincoln Public Library

Established in 1986, the Friends of the Lincoln Public Library (FOLL) is an all-volunteer, membership-supported, non-profit corporation, registered as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization. The City of Lincoln, Sierra College, and Western Placer Unified School District provide much of the funding for Library operations. However, the Library could not provide the programs and services it does without the additional financial support provided by FOLL and the numerous volunteers who give hours of their time.

# What an Exciting Year!

We had an exhilarating year at the Lincoln Public Library. FOLL hosted the first "Library Open House" and continued to expand its Library promotion activities. Our membership numbers grew substantially and the community provided a record level of financial support.

In 2019, FOLL provided over \$50,500 in funds for Library programs and services. These funds enable the Library to provide the Summer Reading Program and various children programs, expand its collections, offer online resources, and more.

# **Library Open House**

The Library's open house offered something for everyone. The fun and informative evening was held on May 2 in conjunction with Big Day of Giving and the FOLL annual membership meeting. The Open House included guided tours of the Library, demonstrations of online resources and the Library and FOLL websites, a self-guided art tour, light refreshments, music, and crafts and story time for youngsters. The 150 attendees had opportunities to learn about the new high school from the Superintendent of Western Placer Unified School District, life-long learning courses from Sierra College, Library volunteer opportunities, and the many ways that FOLL supports the Lincoln Public Library.



# **Summer Reading Program**

FOLL provides the primary funding for the Summer Reading Program. Summer reading programs encourage children and teens to make reading a lifelong habit, draw in reluctant readers with activities, help children keep their skills up over the summer, and generate interest in the library and books. In 2019, 1,251 children and teens read books and completed other literacy-focused activities.





The theme for Summer Reading 2019 was "Showtime at Your Library." FOLL purchased books for reading rewards and theme-based materials. FOLL also paid for four summer reading events: Fenix Dance and Drum, Musical Robots, Puppet Arts Theater and Maquilli Tonatiuh Aztec Dancers.

# **Children's Programs**

Mother Goose on the Loose continues to be a popular program for children ages 0 to 4. In 2019, the Library held 72 sessions attended by over 4,980 children and their parents/caregivers. Marching, rhyming, singing, and more help little ones learn and grow. FOLL provided funds for Library staff time dedicated to this program, new BIG books, a book easel and other needed materials.

Family Story Time provides an enjoyable afternoon once a week for children to listen to books read by volunteers and for parents/ caregivers to learn how they can help their child with literary skill at home. In 2019, the Library held 30 sessions attended by 474 children and their parents/caregivers. FOLL purchased new books for use by story time readers.

**Homework Center** provides a quiet space for K-8 students to study and receive help with their homework. In 2019, the Homework Center was open 92 days with 707 students attending. FOLL supplied the Homework Center with bottled water and snacks.

Family Movie Night offers a movie theater experience to families at no cost. The Library shows a movie each month (except December) and uses that opportunity to talk to attendees about literacy. This popular event was attended by 821 children and adults in 2019. FOLL paid for the movie license and DVDs and members staffed the concession stand. Also, FOLL members help children select a free book for their home libraries.

**May the 4th Be With You** is a fun event for introducing parents and children to the Library. In 2019, 149 attended this event. FOLL paid for the "Star Wars character" actors and provided a free "Star Wars themed" book for each family.

## **Author Events**

# **Library's Collection**

The Library provides our community with the most current books, media and other resources. Each year, FOLL helps the Library by purchasing children's books for the younger patrons and large print books and audio books to ensure our senior patrons, especially those with impaired vision, have access to the latest materials. In 2019, FOLL helped the Library update its collection with the purchase of new technology books.



# **Online Learning**

Patrons can access online information and help anywhere from their own electronic devices with a WiFi connection. Annually, FOLL purchases **EBSCO Host** which provides patrons with multiple resources, including Novelist, Consumer Health Complete, and Legal Information Reference Center. FOLL also purchases **Brainfuse**, which provides tutoring in virtually every subject and access to expert coaches for every stage of a job search. In 2019, FOLL began paying for **Gale Testing and Reference Center**, a valuable online tool library patrons and students of all ages can use for standardized test preparation, researching and selecting college and graduate schools, finding tuition assistance, and exploring careers.





# **Library Elf**



Library Elf is available for patrons to use to keep track of borrowed items and receive email reminders of the date that items need to be returned to the Library. Each year, FOLL pays for this service which helps ensure that items are returned to the Library and that Library patrons avoid late fees.

## **Facilities**

The Library's Willow Room is a community space that is ideal for large meetings or mid-sized events. In 2019, FOLL purchased a wireless microphone for use at author visits and other Library events held in the Willow Room. FOLL also purchased a driveway sign and two walkway signs for promoting Library events. The City will be installing the signs in 2020.







Subject: 2019 FOLL Financial Review Report

The Financial Review Committee met on January 27, 2020 at the Lincoln Public Library to review the financial year-end report for December 31, 2019 and bank statements and supporting documentation for the period January 1 through December 31, 2019. The review committee was comprised of the following FOLL Board members: Mary Nader, Jo Jones and Lynne Rossi.

FOLL's financial assets are currently maintained in three bank accounts: one checking account and two certificates of deposit. FOLL uses cash basis reporting. The Treasurer uses the software program Quicken to maintain the financial records. Revenue is recorded when the deposits are made to the bank. Expenses are recorded when checks are written or electronic fund transfers or other withdrawals are made from the bank. The Treasurer submits a monthly report to the FOLL board on fund balances and revenue and expenses.

#### Our review was limited to:

- Confirming that the beginning balances shown in the Quicken file reconciled to the beginning balance shown on the January 2019 statements provided by the financial institutions holding the FOLL assets.
- Confirming that the ending balances shown in the Quicken file reconciled to the beginning balance shown on the December 2019 statements provided by the financial institutions.
- Confirming that appropriate supporting documentation was on file for deposits made, checks written, electronic fund transfers, and other withdrawals from January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019.

We concluded that the December 31, 2019 year-end report accurately represents the financial status of FOLL. We found no irregularities in the records.

The Financial Review Committee wishes to express gratitude to Gloria Pilotti-Irey, FOLL Treasurer, for her thoroughness and organization of the FOLL records.

# **Director Reports**

#### **Book Sales**

Thanks to the hard work of our dedicated "back room" volunteers who sort books for both the daily sale and Saturday BIG book sales, along with the additional volunteers who come to help at the Saturday sales. The book sale crew generated \$20,168 in sales in 2019. This was an increase from 2018 of approximately 9 percent, 25 percent above our goal of \$15,000 for the year.

Our volunteers passed on donations of popular titles in hardback to the Library, thus saving the Library the expense of purchasing additional copies. We also worked with library staff on the Library's DVDs and audio books collection by using new and near-new donations to replace worn discs and expand the Library collection. In 2019, volunteers processed 486 audio books and 1,090 DVDs, valued at \$24,464.


